III (a) Compering - for Radio and Television

One question with internal alternative shall be set from this area.

(b) General Knowledge (History related to India)

This question, of 3 marks, shall be objective type. One question of three parts - (i), (ii) and (iii) shall be set from this area. Each part shall carry one (1) mark. The answers to each of these questions may vary from one word to one sentence. There shall be no internal alternative in this question.

IV (a) Making commentaries on Radio and Television

One question with internal alternative shall be set from this area.

(b) General Knowledge (Geography related to India)

This question, of 3 marks, shall be objective type. One question of three parts - (i), (ii) and (iii) shall be set from this area. Each part shall carry one (1) mark. The answers to each of these questions may vary from one word to one sentence. There shall be no internal alternative in this question.

3 Marks

UNIT-III

This part shall cover the units mentioned above. It shall carry 30 marks in all. There shall be one question in this unit consisting of two parts. In Part (i) of this question, there shall be five short-answer questions dealing with aspects of Radio and TV Broadcasting. Each question shall be answered in about 30-40 words and shall be of 2 marks each (5x2=10). Part (ii) of this question shall pertain to General Knowledge and Current Affairs and shall carry 20 marks in all. In this part, the examiner shall set 20 questions, each of one (1) mark, based on all the four areas of General Knowledge and Current Affairs in the above-mentioned four sections. The examiner may set multiple-choice questions, fill-in-the-blanks or objective-type questions in which one-word answer is to be given by the

candidate. The examiner may also set questions in which items in column A have to be matched with their counterparts in column B.
